• Journal standing and position within its subject category. • Narrative justification of the publication's citations, including standardized citation metrics, field-normalized indicators and the scientific recognition of the publication within the research community (excluding self-citations). Special consideration will be given to publications ranked among the top 10% most cited worldwide in their research field. • Comparison of the publication's citation performance with the average performance of publications in the subject category in which it is indexed.	• Existence of a patent or clinical practice guideline derived from the publication. • Contribution of the publication to the implementation of public policies. • Social and media impact achieved through the dissemination of research findings in traditional and digital media.	• Contribution to the manuscript. • Authorship position, with particular value given to first, senior (last) and corresponding authorship. • A main author is defined as a researcher listed as first author, senior (last) author or corresponding author. • A maximum of three shared first-author, shared senior-author or shared corresponding-author positions will be considered.	• Alignment of the publication with the author's research career. • Consistency of the publication with the overall research trajectory of the Principal Investigator (PI). • Relevance of the publication to the research proposal submitted and its contribution to the author's long-term scientific development.

Evaluation Criteria and Methodology: maximum score: 4 points; 1 point per criteria.
